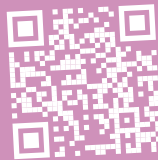

They also run a weekly workshop in North Lincolnshire and have a workshop in West Lindsey making items for Angel gowns and looking after their 300 plus volunteers.

His musical 'Frank's Closet' had three London productions last year, (including Wilton's Music Hall and the West End). Stuart is based in Cleethorpes and runs Grim & Gleeeful CIC, a place-based culture organisation.

ABBIE JENNINGS Abbie is a Hull-based arts and culture photographer. Her personal and commissioned practice explores aspects of subcultures and personal nostalgia. She has a first-class degree in Photography and an MA in Art Gallery and Museum Studies. In 2023, she received a DYCP grant from Arts Council England to develop her curatorial practice, and in 2025, she founded Over the Bridge, a collaborative network for photographers in the Humber region.

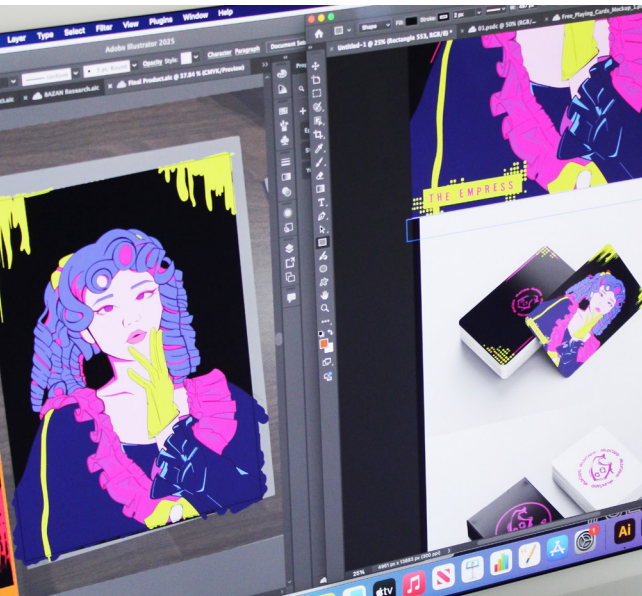


MUSICAL THEATRE

Join us for an exciting, hands-on workshop where you'll dive into the world of contemporary British musical theatre. You'll learn and rehearse music from a show, collaborate with others to co-create movement, and bring an ensemble number to life through hands-on performance. GRAPHIC DESIGN

Join this fast-paced, structured session exploring identity. Using the Design Sprinting framework, we'll rapidly visualise challenges and test creative solutions. This method focuses on clear, goal driven problem solving. This quick-moving studio culture encourages innovation through a flexible yet disciplined approach, helping participants generate impactful ideas quickly.



EXPLORING CONTEMPORARY DANCE This energetic dance workshop gives you a taste of what it's like to study dance at university. The practical workshop will provide insight into the styles of contemporary dance studied at Lincoln, looking at release-based work and exploring key movement principles such as flow, energy, and momentum.

HOW MUSICIANS GET PAID, GET INSPIRED AND MAKE A DIFFERENCE

Join us for an exciting, hands-on workshop where you'll dive into the world of contemporary British musical theatre. You'll learn and rehearse music from a show, collaborate with others to co-create movement, and bring an ensemble number to life through hands-on performance. FINE ART - ALIEN EMBODIMENT WORKSHOP

This interactive "Alien Embodiment Laboratory" combines elements of art and psychology, offering an exploration of body, movement, and identity through alien-inspired concepts.

ANIMATION Explore the art of character creation in this engaging, hands-on workshop! Students will learn how to design original characters by experimenting with shape, silhouette, and proportion to create unique personalities. Working through quick sketching exercises, you'll discover how small design choices, such as size, posture, and exaggeration can completely change how a character is read. We'll also explore facial expressions, costumes, and style to bring individuality and storytelling into your designs. No prior experience is required, just a willingness to draw and experiment. By the end of the workshop, you will have your own original character concept ready to develop further.

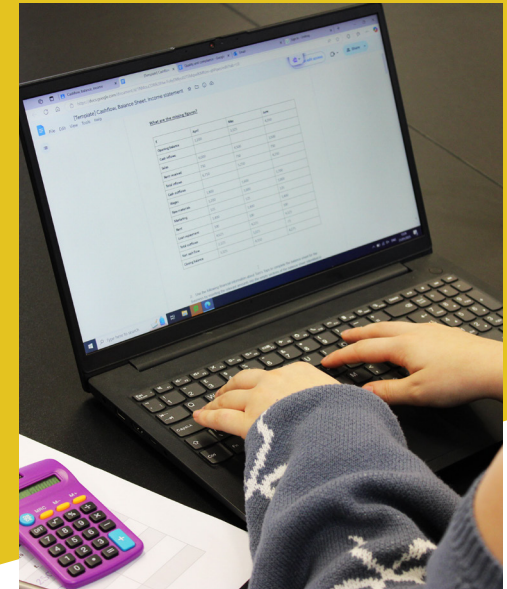

PHOTOGRAPHY TRANSFORMING THE ORDINARY

Step into the world where every day becomes extraordinary. In this hands-on photography workshop for young creatives, you'll explore how to build imaginative scenes using model figures and what's right in front of you. Learn to see your surroundings through a new lens – playing with light, angles and storytelling to create striking miniature worlds. Using simple techniques and big ideas, we'll turn your classroom into a set for surprising and magical images. Discover how photography isn't just about capturing what you see – it's about seeing differently.

GAMES DESIGN IDEATION

A group workshop designed to get you working together to generate an idea for a video game based on a selection of stimulus that includes, genre, age rating, location, aesthetic, mechanics, and characters.



WRITING THE FUTURE

An interactive, writing-focused workshop that encourages student creativity. A suite of interactive quizzes, the gamification of creative practice and clear guidance from published authors gives students invaluable guidance for developing their creative writing. Encourages students to build on areas of personal passion and interest as they create a brand-new world of their own, along with a cast of fascinating characters to people it - and a dramatic opening that supports students who want to continue writing once the session is completed.



DESIGN THINKING

This innovative workshop will begin by introducing design thinking as a way to prevent the fear of the 'blank white page'. We'll talk about how this process helps spark creative thoughts and generate new ideas. We'll discuss the importance of thumbnail sketches and create as many ideas as you can in a set period of time. We'll then look at the ideas you have developed, and look at how to take them forward, and identify a great idea.



MOVIE MAKE-UP MAGIC

Step into the world of Movie Make-up Magic with Grimsby Institutes Special Effects Make-up Design and Prosthetics degree. The workshop is led by our industry-experienced tutors, who will share insights and stories from their experiences in film and television. You'll also have the chance to take part in an interesting Q&A session and a live prosthetic application demonstration. There will also be an opportunity to view some of our students' weird and wonderful creations.

Please note: this workshop will include blood and gore!
